Unsafe Housing Traps Families in Poverty

Unsafe Housing Traps Families in Poverty The grueling challenges faced by the families featured in this appeal are tragically common in Guatemala. In fact, nearly 60% of Guatemalans live in poverty, with two-thirds of the population living on less than \$2 a day. (CIA World Factbook and World Food Programme)

But there is hope! Through the gift of sturdy homes, the Church provides a lifeline so suffering families in remote villages can gain the foundation they need to escape the hardships of extreme poverty plaguing their communities.

This is particularly important to families that live in isolated areas because they have no other place to turn for help. Even though Guatemala's economy is the largest in Central America, those economic benefits simply do not reach the country's remote regions where most people live. This makes the Church the only reliable source of help when families face desperate situations.

The daily challenges of such poverty include:

• **Reduced crop yields**: Over the past three years, extended dry seasons have reduced crop yields, severely impacting the livelihoods of subsistence farmers, who rely on rain-fed agriculture to feed their families.

• **Surging Inflation**: Higher costs make it harder for families to plant much-needed crops. As the cost of fertilizer skyrockets, families can't afford it, so their crop yields decrease.

• Malnutrition: 47% of children under 5 in Guatemala are malnourished, one of the world's highest rates. (The World Bank)

• **Stunting**: Poor nutrition has led to stunted growth in 47% of children under 5, and the rate of stunting reaches up to 70% in the poorest regions. (World Food Programme)

For families living in makeshift homes, overcoming poverty without outside intervention is nearly impossible. Parents spend their limited resources on shoring up decaying walls and roofs, but their children still lack a safe place to rest and study. As a result, it is common for young boys and girls to fall behind in class and eventually drop out of school altogether.

By supporting Cross Catholic Outreach's effort to build safe homes for the poor in Guatemala, you will be giving these families the boost they need to create a safe living environment and participate in the life-transforming outreaches of our in-country ministry partner.
